Mandatory Conditions (Sections 19, 20, 21 LA2003)

1. There shall be no sale or supply of alcohol when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of this premises licence or at a time when the said premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or when his/her licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. Admission of children (under the age of 18) to any exhibition of films must be restricted in accordance with the film classification body designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.
4. Where the film classification is not specified or the relevant licensing authority has notified the premises licence holder under Section 20 (3)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the Licensing Authority.
5. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children -
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - i. drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - ii. drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

- i. the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - ii. the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 8. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark (comes into force on the 1st October 2010).
- 9. The responsible person shall ensure that -
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - i. beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - ii. gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - iii. still wine in glass: 125 ml; and
 - b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures (comes into force 1st October 2010).

Mandatory Conditions - (Embedded Restrictions) - Attached as part of Conversion Application under Transitional Grandfather Rights

- 10. This licence is subject to the standard conditions converted from the community premises public entertainment licence.
- 11. The licensee shall have regard and comply with any relevant provisions of the following enactments during any licensable activities taking place on the premises :-
 - a. Children and Young Persons Act 1933
 - b. Cinematograph (Safety) Regulations 1955
 - c. Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol Etc) Act 1985

12. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol shall be properly trained and instructed in the importance of not selling alcohol to persons under the age of 18 years.

Conditions attached after Mediation - Attached as Part of Variation Application

13. Signs shall be displayed at exits requesting that patrons leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner.
14. Suitable means of proof of age shall be requested from persons who do not appear to have attained the age of 21 years to prove they are over 18 years before the sale of alcohol is granted.
15. The supply of alcohol at the premises shall be restricted to pre-booked and organised events only.
